What are NETs?

Neuroendocrine tumours (NETs) are tumours that usually develop in the digestive or respiratory tracts, but can occur in other areas of the body. These tumours arise from cells called neuroendocrine cells. Neuroendocrine cells create, store and secrete proteins and hormones for normal body functions.

NETs develop when these neuroendocrine cells undergo changes, causing them to divide uncontrollably and grow into a mass (called a tumour).

Neuroendocrine tumours can be very slow-growing or can be more aggressive. While they were once thought to be non-cancerous (benign), we now know that these tumours can be cancerous.

While NETs are commonly referred to as neuroendocrine tumours, the location of the tumour may also be added to the name: for example, lung NET, bowel NET or pancreatic NET.
