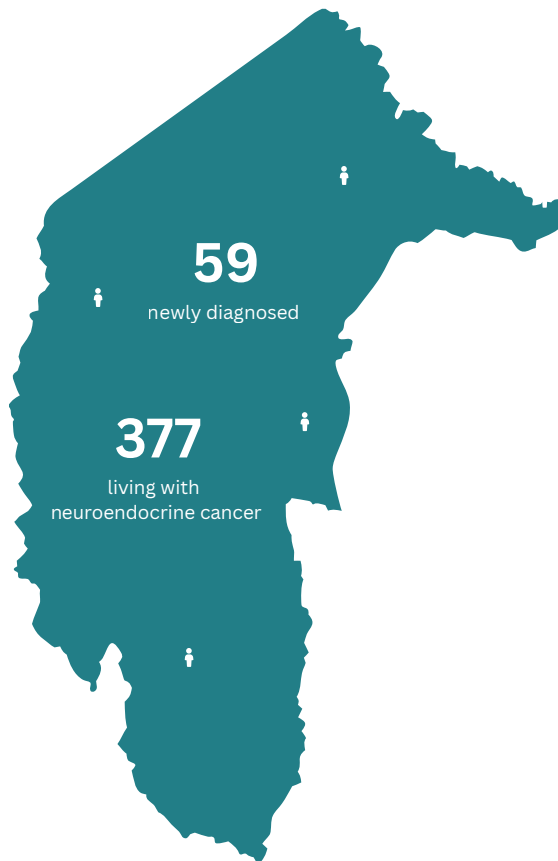

In ACT alone our NET patients make up 1% of all calls to the specialist NET Nurse line, making 63 contacts in the last year alone
