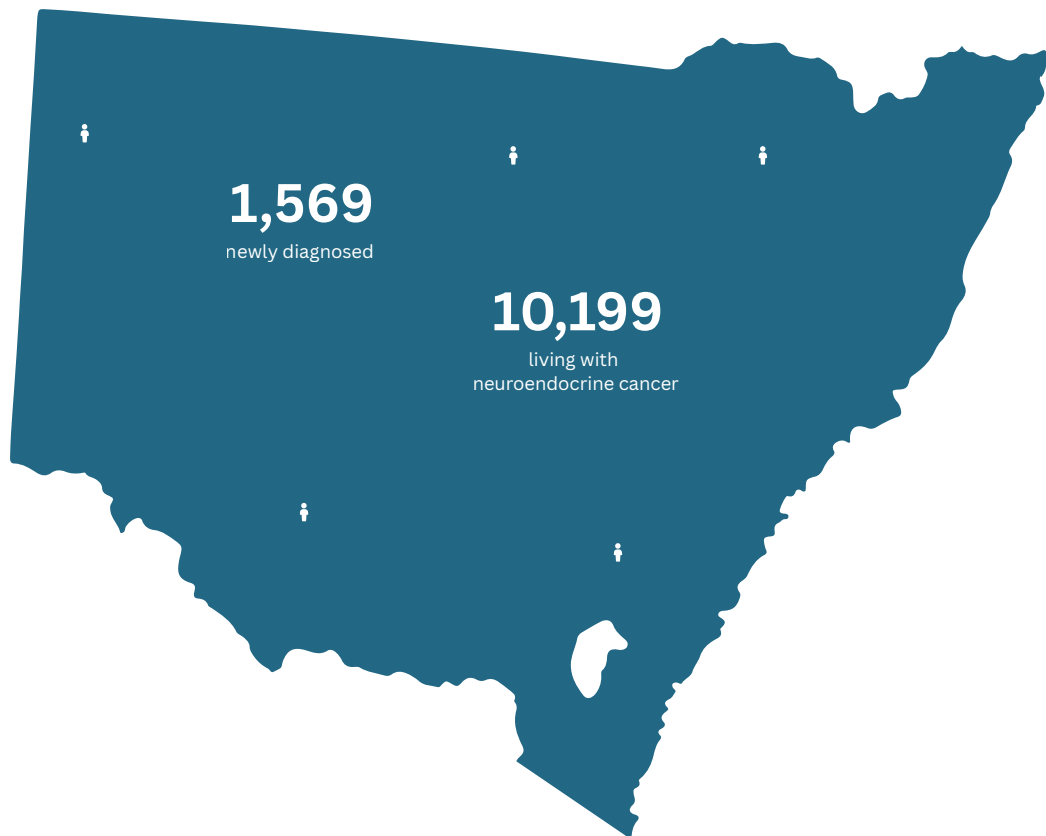

In NSW alone our NET patients make up almost 26% of all calls to the specialist NET Nurse line, making 1,334 contacts in the last year alone
